

PUPIL PREMIUM STRATEGY 2013 – 2014

Funding and Investment

Funding Received in 2012-2013: £191,700

The college has received funding of £900 per Pupil Premium student and £300 per Services Child.

Investment for this academic year was as follows:

- **Pupil Premium Curriculum Support Fund**
This fund is set aside to support specific initiatives in departments to support PP/S students' progress and achievement. Funding is awarded on the basis of improved achievement and impact.
- **Pupil Premium Disadvantaged Fund**
This fund is set aside to purchase resources, equipment and direct finance support for PP/S students, (KS3/4 revision guides, school planners, food for Food Technology, support for school trips, scientific calculators etc.).
- **Additional interventions and provisions – contribution to salary, resources and maintenance.**
- **Pupil Premium Intervention support co-ordinator (1 x FTE)**
Student performance data is analysed to identify underachievement and target intervention strategies, (e.g. personalised support programmes, mentoring, continuity – one point of contact, communication with parents, co-ordination of specialist teacher input, monitoring catch up progress).
- **Pupil Premium LSA Support**
This is used to support students with classwork, coursework and revision at KS3 and KS4 in Maths and English. Student data is continuously monitored to support students working to their target grades, by determining and facilitating intervention needed.
- **Targeted intervention in English**
Additional staffing used to provide after school workshops, targeted additional staffing, booster sessions, exam skills workshops. Since September students have been withdrawn from core PE and RE for additional literacy support from specialist English teachers.
- **Targeted intervention in Mathematics**
Since September; 7 lessons/cycle and Easter an additional 2 lessons per cycle are used to provide additional support in Maths. Students are withdrawn from core PE and RE and taught in small groups by specialist Maths teachers. Six after school sessions are targeted at catch up students.
- **Literacy and numeracy support groups**
Additional provision at KS3 to address student progress that is below expected levels of progress in English and Maths.

- **KS3 and KS4 Achievement Co-ordinator**
Analysis and reporting of the progress and achievement of PP/S students is carried out by the KS3 and KS4 Achievement Co-ordinators.
- **Staff Training and INSET**
This will support staff in understanding Pupil Premium and how we as a school can provide the most effective support for Pupil Premium students.
