



Sixth Form Dress Code

Students should dress appropriately for the formality of attending college with the mindset of dressing for the workplace. We feel that students should wear non-uniform that promotes personal preference whilst also being a role model for younger students within our school community. Please find below the boundaries outlined for our sixth form expectations.

Code	Guidance
Trousers	Tailored full length trousers Tailored shorts in summer
Skirts/Dresses	Tailored appearance No shorter than 5cm above the knee
Tops	Tailored shirt/blouse Smart polo shirt All tops must protect students' modesty
Jumpers/Blazers	Plain Jumpers or blazers
Footwear	Formal shoes/boots with low heel
Tights	Plain or discreet pattern
Make up	Discreet simple make up, natural appearance
Hair	Natural colours allowed, if dyed. No extreme haircuts
Jewellery	In line with college expectations
Body Art	Tattoos must be covered. No excessive piercings allowed.

The following are NOT appropriate for Sixth Form:

Trainers/Canvas shoes/Converse/UGG's/Crocs/Vans/High heels/Flip flops

Lykra/Elastane body con dresses/ Sweatshirts/Denim/Leather/Leggings/Combat trousers/Tracksuits

Offensive/ violent slogans or images on clothing

Cropped tops/Strapless tops/Vest tops/Low cut tops/Off the shoulder tops

Enforcement:

1. Spoken to by Sixth Form Tutor, and where possible, item to be removed for the remainder of the day.
2. Spoken to by Sixth Form Tutor and phone call to parent/carer made. Where possible, item to be removed for the remainder of the day.
3. Spoken to by Sixth Form Leadership Team. Contact parents/carer. Where possible, item to be removed for the remainder of the day.
4. If the student continues to flout the uniform rules which are of the College expectations, the student will be formally asked to leave the College.
